What questions...

1. What is the Manos Internacional Teaching in China program and what would be needed to qualify or apply to the program? The Teaching in China program is a summer camp program that incorporates English classes along with cultural activities for students from grades 2nd to 12th in select schools and cities in China. To qualify for the program you must be a minimum 3rd or 4th year student in a university, a college graduate, or a certified teacher, and have a valid U.S. or Canadian passport.

2. What are the dates of the program? There are 2 programs in 2 different cities. Hangzhou and Beijing, China

- 1st – Hangzhou China is from **July 6th – August 1st, 2012**
- 2nd – Beijing, China is from **August 11th – August 31st, 2012**

These dates include training dates and days off. *There is a Manos tour that is offered to the teachers from August 2nd to August 9th. For information contact John Alvarez at jon@manosinternacional.org*

How questions...

3. How much do teachers get paid? It depends on your experience in the Teaching in China program. Below is a chart:

1st Camp in Hangzhou from July 6th to August 1st, 2012

- 1st year teachers earn --- **¥7,500 / \$1,200 USD**
- 2nd year teachers earn --- **¥8,000 / \$1,270 USD**
- 3rd year teachers earn --- **¥9,000 / \$1,430 USD**

2nd Camp in Beijing from August 11th to August 31st, 2012

- 1st year teachers earn --- **¥8,000 / \$1,270 USD**
- 2nd year teachers earn --- **¥8,500 / \$1,350 USD**
- 3rd year teachers earn --- **¥9,000 / \$1,430 USD**
- 4th year teachers earn --- **¥9,500 / \$1,500 USD**

4. How many days and hours a week do teachers work? The program is scheduled for 20 work days and teachers work no more than 5 hours a day.

Who questions...

5. Who will pay for the airline tickets and visa? If accepted teachers are responsible for purchasing the airline tickets and cover the cost of a working visa (\$150).

6. Who will be in China to receive the teachers? Teachers arriving on the designated arrival date and location will be received by a Manos Internacional representative and transported to their work location.

a When question...

7. When should teachers purchase airline tickets and apply for the visa to China? Once accepted, Manos Internacional will coordinate arrival and departure dates as well as airports, and locations where to meet. Teachers will then be given a date of when to begin to search for their tickets. Teachers will then be responsible for arriving at the designated airport on the date requested. Manos Internacional will also coordinate and facilitate with acquiring a working visa to China.

Where questions...

8. Where and what do teachers eat? While teaching, all teachers receive 3 Chinese meals (Breakfast, Lunch, & Dinner) daily or a stipend equivalent to 3 meals a day.

9. Where do teachers stay and will it be internet accessible? Housing is equivalent to a double hotel room and its 2 teachers per room. Internet is available to the teachers so lap tops are recommended to communicate back home, but not required.

Can questions...

10. Can applicants apply to only one camp or is it required to apply to both? No, applicants are welcome to apply for 1 if they desire. However, it should be mentioned when applying to the program which camp they are applying for. \$50 processing fee is the same if you apply for 1 or both camps. Space is limited in both programs.

11. Can we go out and experience the city after work hours? Yes, after a work day is done, teachers are free to go out and explore the city on their own.

a Will question...

12. Will there be enough time for teachers to travel to other cities? While working, local city tours will be set up for teachers to enjoy. However, China is a very large country, so travelling to another province on 1 or 2 days off will be quite difficult and almost impossible. Manos Internacional does organize a multicity tour for teachers from August 2nd to August 9th, 2012. Teachers are welcome to take advantage of the tour or if they choose or travel on their own.
